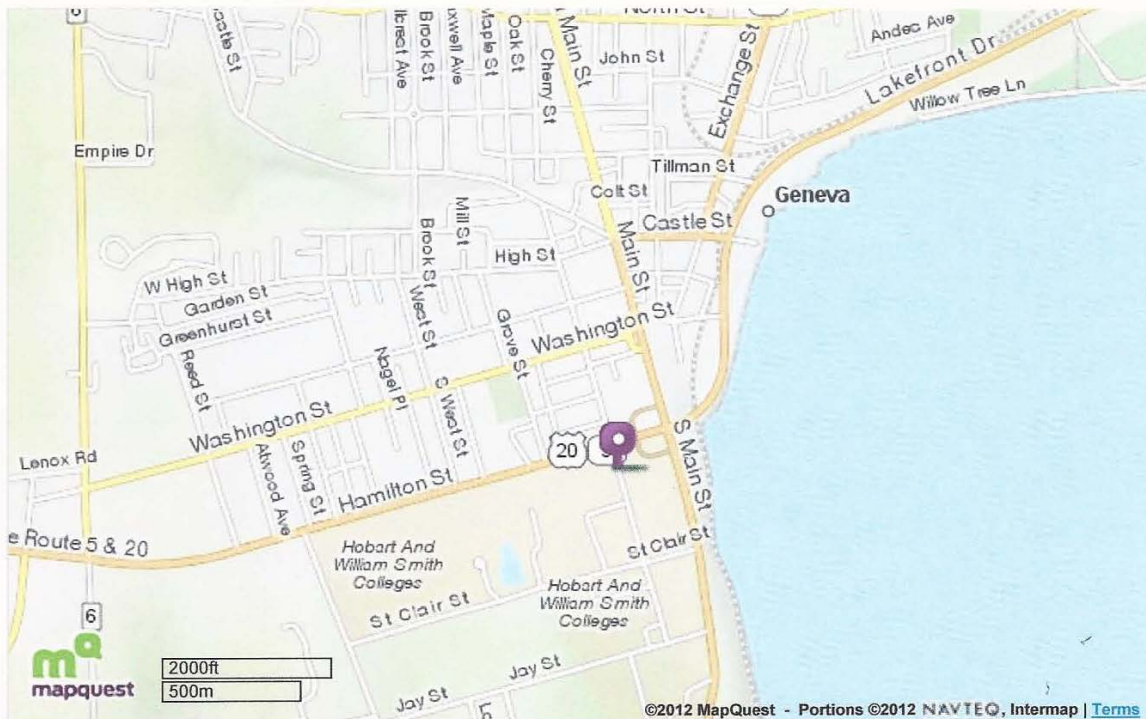

Directions from the North

From the New York State Thruway (I-90), take exit 42 - Geneva. Once through the toll booth, take a right, heading south on Route 14 toward Geneva. Travel approximately 5.8 miles through the City of Geneva. Turn right on Seneca Street. Travel to the top of the hill to the "T" intersection. Turn left on South Main Street/Route 14. Continue approximately .7 miles. And follow the signs

Directions from the East

Follow Routes 5&20 west till it intersects with Pulteney St. and at the traffic light turn left and follow the signs.

Directions from the West

Follow Routes 5&20 east till it intersects with Pulteney St. and at the traffic light turn right and follow the signs.

Directions from the South

From the Southern Tier Expressway (Route I-86/17), take the Elmira exit off I-86 for Route 14 North. Follow Route 14, approximately 50 miles, until you reach Geneva and follow the signs.

What Kind of an EMT Do You Want To Be: Plotting a Successful Course in the Ever Changing World of EMS

An EMT today faces a world that is more dynamic, more innovative and more rapidly evolving than any other time in the history of emergency medicine. Managing education, clinical skills and customer service can seem insurmountable tasks especially in a age where "moving the goal posts" is more the norm than the exception. How does a new EMT judge what concepts are most important to learn and what skills are most critical to creating a meaningful and fulfilling career? How does an experienced EMT avoid the pitfalls of mediocrity? This interactive discussion will reflect upon 28 years of EMS service and point to best practices learned both the easy way and the hard way.

Standing on the Shoulders of Giants: The Role of the Mentor in Emergency Medical Services

No one learns EMS straight from a textbook. All great practitioners have become great by making mistakes, falling down and coming up short. The far too often unnoticed treasure of real EMS education is the benevolent few who spend time coaching counselling and supporting when those actions are needed the most. This talk will discuss the role of mentors in the development of EMS systems and describe the importance of standing others up rather than tearing them down. We will describe opportunities that exist all around us to pull our collective industry up by the bootstraps and demonstrate winning strategies that each of us can employ.

Virtual Anatomy Lab – Get a chance to see the body like you never have before. Dr. Davidoff in conjunction with the staff at the New York Chiropractic College will explore the human body at different levels.

Thoracic Trauma – The battlefield. It's all around us. From the highway to unthinkable terrorist attacks thoracic trauma is very real and often underdiagnosed and under-treated. Learn how to assess for these injuries and how to fix them. We can learn a lot from the military and tactical medicine. This workshop will better prepare you for our everyday battlefield.

Strangulation Injuries in the Domestic Violence Patient: Why EMS Plays a Critical Role
Domestic violence patients face a variety of challenges that frequently involve EMS. From critical medical interventions to access to social services, EMS practitioners provide a vital service. With strangulation injuries however, the EMS response is even more important. Beyond the obvious threats to airway and breathing, identification of these injuries can provide hugely important insight into the ongoing safety of the patient. A victim of domestic violence who is strangled by their intimate partner is 800 times more likely to be killed. Are you prepared to recognize this warning sign?

When Seconds Count – Lives depend upon our ability to make critical decisions. Today's environment requires us to make those decisions for ourselves and our partners in addition to our patients. Mark will explore great tools available to assist us.

Documentation – One of the essential parts of the job but often the most difficult for many people. Even with the advantages of electronic platforms good can prove to be a challenge. During this interactive workshop we will review the basic necessities of good documentation.

BLS: It's More Than You Think – This workshop reviews a number of different interventions at the BLS level that make a significant difference in the morbidity and mortality of our patients.

50 Shades of Blue: We Are All Playing On The Same Team – As professional responders we often are faced with complex situations that require a combination of teams to work together. This session will highlight case studies of how emergency medicine, firefighters, law enforcement, nurses, surgeons, heavy recover and community leaders can come together to improve outcomes in emergencies.

Toxicology – This workshop looks at how some substance that we take for granted, such as liquid nicotine, can be harmful or even fatal when used either improperly or are accidentally ingested.
